In the blink of an eye, Chris and I have lived in China for fourteen years. The people and circumstances around us are always changing. We have seen countless destitute and disabled children that prompt me to ask the question: "Why are there so many children that need help?" Then I'll answer it myself: "It's because they are children, so they are helpless, and they need help from the adults.' Therefore, we keep our own undertaking.



In two years since the founding of the Myanmar Silver Lining Family Village, we have taken in almost a hundred orphans and extremely impoverished children. We want to document some of the children's stories and share them with everyone. Upon inquiring a few children about the happenings before, they could not come up with answers as they left the past behind them. I asked them why couldn't they remember? Their responses are quite remarkable: "Here at the Village, we have food, we study, and we have a mother who loves us, so we forget the things in the past." I realized in an instant that in a caring environment, they can really forget the unpleasant memories from the past, and obviously, I am grateful for them.

Upon seeing the Family Village children study together, and they sing and dance together, I'll shed some tears of joy for them with deep gratitude. It's because they no longer need to live in uncertainty, terrified about war, worry about food and clothing, take refuge, and the opportunity to get an education. They can finally go back to live the normal children's life at the Family Village.





Holding on to Every Second of Happiness

It's my honor to receive the invitation to visit the Silver Lining Family Village in Myanmar. Before departure, I was feeling the excitement nervousness! It's exciting because this would be my first visit to Myanmar and I have never visited an orphanage before. I also had some apprehensions about the hygiene of Myanmar. Then I don't know if the children would like my gifts to them, and whether they might be shy enough to connect with me. So I embarked on the journey to Myanmar with restlessness.

After arriving at the Silver Lining Family Village when I realized my apprehension was unfounded. The hygiene at the Family Village is very good, some areas are even better than Hong Kong in their cleanliness, and the facilities are well equipped. There are about 80 children at the Family Village, all of them are well–mannered and cheerful. They have smiles on their faces all the time and there is a feeling they strive to hold on to every second of happiness. They waited patiently in line while I was giving out the prepared gifts. Then they thanked me with reverence, and their innocent and charming demeanors won me over totally.

What moved me the most was not their maturity, it was rather their ability to share with others their love and joyful heart. I remembered when I was teaching the children how to knit bracelets, upon finishing the ones they made for themselves, then they began knitting another one without

hesitation. Out of curiosity, I asked them why they kept on knitting, and they told me that they were for the mothers and other children of the Family Village. That was such a touching moment for me! For I know they do things from the heart, a pure desire to share the joy with everyone around them. One day, the children and I went to the lawn to play games. With so many children running around, it became inevitable someone would bump into each other. Whenever a child fell inadvertently, the other children would come to his assistance promptly. All the above goings–on impress me that the Silver Lining Family Village is really filled with love.

I think it's the invaluable group of "mothers" that the children are so loved. Every mother will take care of ten children as they live as one family at the Silver Lining Family Village. I lived with one of the mothers for one day and I saw that she would teach the children about respect and proper behaviors, in addition to taking care of their daily lives. The parent-children dynamics are no different than an actual family. I sincerely admire these mothers because it's not doing a job when they take care of the children, as they treat them as their own. I heard that one of the mothers asked for a few days off to visit relatives back home. Her children were reluctant to let her go once they got words of it and they kept begging her to stay. It's obvious the children and their mothers at the Family Village have already established close relationships and trust, and they become a non-blood related family.

Although the children are very happy at the Family Village, let us not forget that they are orphans, and the inner healing won't happen in an instant. One day during the visit, a boy that was particularly close to me yelled my name at me while I was playing with the other children. He wanted me to play with him, but I did not hear it because the place was quite noisy. He was quite dejected when I failed to respond, and he kept asking other



people: "Is my sister snubbing me? Is she deserting me?" I was very upset once I learned about it because I knew what was going through his mind. He lost love and care once before. Although he has this extended Silver Lining family now, he is still quite insecure deep inside, and his heart is eager for warmth and love, and he's afraid to lose the care of the others again. Therefore, we need to give our children more love and support, so they receive healing for their wounded hearts.

This visit leads me to a broad introspection about life. Once again, I can tell my present life is a very happy one, and the troubles and stress in my work are insignificant. Happiness is plain and simple. We must learn to live a life of contentment, instead of assuming a sense of entitlement. There are still many children living in poverty around the world who need our help. I hope to share the thoughts and feelings of the visit with the people around me. Finally, I want to say thank-you to Lydia and Silver Lining, because of your love and support, opportunity and hope await for the children's robust development!





I am Happy that You're Happy

The phrase "I'm happy that you're happy" is undoubtedly fitting towards our relatives and loved ones, but it seems odd using it to address the strangers. Would you randomly cheer for the happiness of a stranger? Lydia, however, is such a person as she is willing to extend her comforting hands and to lavish selfless love to some strangers. After several days of interactions with the children, I found that the older children not only help the younger siblings in their daily lives, they also volunteer to help relieve the burden of their foster moms by rinsing and cutting the vegetables that they bought them home. They are good kids, self-disciplined, affectionate with each other, eager to learn and grateful. I hope these well-mannered children will lead a life of happiness as they continue to spread the love and make this world a better place. I hope everyone will also support Silver Lining, and to sustain this selfless love.





A Growing Up Experience

During this Easter break, our team of eight members, including my four family members paid a six-day visit to the Silver Lining Family Village in Myanmar. I was very excited about the trip, and we made lots of preparations and rehearsals before leaving, such as designing the run down, games, activities, songs, bible stories, messages, snacks as well as souvenirs.

The first day upon our arrival, many adorable children greeted us with smiles on their faces. We presented the children with lovely animal balloons and pocket notebook with pen sets as a gift in a large classroom. We then sang the worship songs and played some games with them. The highlight was a special treat we made to look like the face of Jonah. By using cotton candy dipped into chocolate and laying eyes made with frosting as well as an M&M chocolate nose on top. That was the first time ever the children tasted cotton candy. They were in awe of its taste, and we chatted with them while they were sampling the treats.

The temperature soared above 38°C the next day. To combat the hot weather, we indulged the children in a game of water balloon fight at the outdoor basketball court. Although the outside heat was intense, my younger sister and I went out with the children. We filled up a thousand water balloons to play the game. It was super fun and we were ecstatic. We ended up getting ourselves all wet, but there was not a better way to cool off.

The work habits of the children impressed me a great deal. They began the day with classes between six and seven o'clock in the morning before going to school, and they went to tutoring groups after school. We taught them some English story during our stay. They were very eager to take in all the knowledge and they also tried to sing the songs in English with us. They were very enthusiastic in both learning and meeting new friends. They inspired me a lot.

Moreover, the children are responsible for doing household chores like washing their clothes and cleaning the dishes after every meal. That work was a lot more than what my sister and I would do. The children would take every opportunity to learn whatever is available to them. Now that I have seen how hard these children work. It challenges me to put in extra effort to catch up with them and I should never give up on anything.

One of the most precious things I come across this trip is their smiles. They all smile every day, every minute, and even every second. They never complain, and they ask to do more. They are always grateful for what they have. Their smiles simply melt my heart for they are priceless. We should all learn from the children to be grateful for what we have. Although it was hard to say goodbye, I could never forget their smiling faces. I know I need to stay strong for them.

The trip wasn't like anything I have ever experienced before, and mere words cannot describe how much it changed me. I am so thankful that I have learned so much from this trip and it is so meaningful to my life. I hope I'll get a chance to meet them again and I can't wait to see what the future holds for them.

The Joy of Sharing

The Singapore team and I visited the Myanmar Silver Lining Family Village in mid–May. On the first day, we had to make a flight transfer from Yangon to Mandalay, then we arrived at Pyin Oo Lwin in a ride. This small hill town is located at an altitude of 1,000 meters, having a cooler climate than Yangon, but the average temperature is still above 30°C with very dry weather.

The Silver Lining Family Village has about 150 children aged between 3–12, about 100 are Family Village children, the other 50 are impoverished children from the local community. They are all very well-mannered and disciplined, and their demeanors are so affable. When they heard us calling: "Kids!" They would respond instantly: "Quiet, please!" Then a hush swiftly fell over and it was just so lovely! During the visit, we sang, made a craft as well as storytelling with the children together, and they also performed skits and rhythmic dance. The talent show competition was the most memorable event. The children were skillful, passionate and they performed with dazzle that earned a big round of applause from us.



I come away with many precious memories and thoughts from this visit, and everything is hard to forget. The other team members and I have more opportunities to understand and interact with each other, and we cherish our friendships. Moreover, we ran into many unexpected situations during the trip, but we hung in there and worked together to give our team a boost.

Although the children are orphans, they are humble, courteous and independent under the care and guidance of Silver Lining. Not only will they do their own laundry, but they also help in housekeeping and cleaning. Even younger children learn to develop their responsibilities. The Silver Lining Family Village operates under the family model. Every family has foster-mother taking care of ten children of different ages. Seeing the warm interaction among the family gives me good vibes. Every mother regards the children of the Family Village as their own children, showering them with care and love. The Mother's Day happened during our visit, the children gifted their mothers with their own made flower bouquets to confess their gratitude and love towards them. Upon receiving the aifts, the mothers were so overcome with emotions as they cried while hugging their children. It's in fact very difficult to take care of 10 children all at once, but I believe every mother's heart is full of joy and satisfaction by the children displaying their virtue.

This trip also stirs me to think about many things. For example, we failed to find any fan at the Family Village. Initially, we were

guite disturbed as in such hot weather, why was there not any fan installation? After inquiring in earnest, it turned out the local electricity supply was inadequate to cover even the most basic demands, so the fan was a luxury. On the other hand, urban dwellers are not in lack of anything, as fans and air-conditioning are widely available. Having this opulence, we cannot fancy ourselves to long for a simple life. Moreover, the children will not leave any leftovers after they eat, and they will continue to wear their worn clothing despite the holes. I am so grief-stricken! While we are all about staying forefront with fashion, there are still so many people in this world that are struggling to meet their basic subsistence.

It really touched me, however, upon seeing the children growing up strong despite the adversity. I remembered one day a little boy brought a glass of water especially for me after dinner. Although he was a bit shy, he had a caring and loving heart. The children willingly shared with us while eating their snacks. We took our bites sharing with joy. In fact, happiness is so simple, it's the joy of sharing! Finally, I would like to thank Chris and his daughter Rachel for their company and care, and I thank you for your sustained efforts. I'll continue to bless the children of the Silver Lining Family Village, as I see the joy of simplicity in them! I also see the power of courage and diligence!

FANG FANG -

Foster Mother of Myanmar Silver Lining Family Village _

I'm grateful for the opportunity to become a foster mother working for the Silver Lining Family Village. I remember dealing with many challenges when I first came to this big family. For example, I had a hard time dealing with the children when they threw tantrums, and I also felt exhausted physically and mentally having to care for the children around the clock. Once I learned about the children's past and their happenings, I felt strongly it's such meaningful work to become their mother and raising them. Since many of these children have lost their entire family, their emotions become sensitive and vulnerable in the absence of parental care, and the path of growing up is shrouded in darkness and confusion. My work is to guide them with love, so they'll find their directions and goals in life as well as giving them a home.



The Silver Lining Family Village's mode of operation is quite unique that sets it apart from the traditional orphanage. At the Village, ten children will form a small family, and a foster mother will take over to take care of all facets of life for the children. This family model fosters a tighter knit relationship between the mother and children, and the children are better off in their development. In the evening, the children will gather by my side for story-telling, once it's over, I'll engage them individually for counseling and discussions so that I can monitor their physical and mental states. We hope the children will pick up the long-lost feeling that someone care for them, and the revival of the family bond. Therefore, these orphans who receive love and affirmation, and their development will make it back on a solid footing.

Our previous residence had tight living quarters, and the number of rooms was inadequate. Each room housed seven to eight children in a crowded environment and the children were more susceptible to infectious diseases such as flu. The construction of a new Silver Lining Family Village was completed last year. The new Village is in fabulous condition. I still remember the day when we moved into the new home, the children were so ecstatic that they jumped up and down like crazy. I can still recall these images vividly. I believe the new Family Village offers a better setting for the children's development.

Finally, I'd like to thank the overseas coworkers who are always there to help and support us. Your fervent support keeps the Family Village going. In addition, Silver Lining provides an assortment of training to the foster mothers to help us learn how to care for the children. There are times when we feel tired or frustrated from our work, but we can share and encourage each other, and we feel reinvigorated to keep going forward. I pledge to give good care and my endless love for every child in the days to come.

I'm the new foster mother Zhao Guilan, having joined the Silver Lining Family Village less than a year ago. I remembered at the time of my arrival, the children and I still lived at the old Silver Lining Family Village. After completion of the new Family Village, the children and I are having a much closer relationship because we live and stav at the new home together, and I also play with them and prepare their meals every day. Eventually, the children open their heart to me and our relationship is flourishing. I'm happy and elated when I hear them calling me "mom" and saying, "I love you".

For example, when I was playing with the children, they would hold onto me happily calling me "mom"; when I was preparing dinner at the kitchen, they would come over to help me and they stayed around to chat with me; after finished cooking, they would also say "Thank-you mom, I love you!" 

Two years into the training, the younger brother can move freely and he's in grade school while the elder brother continues his rehabilitation training at the Service Center. As for the children, although they have been saddled with pain and suffering since birth, with the support from all walks of life, they have gradually gained confidence with the hope to live like typical children in the future. I feel this event is a great help to the children, they were so happy to participate in the marathon walk as they received the services of so many volunteers who embraced them lovingly.

Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center - Lin Zhiru



Hi Everyone! My name is Lin Zhiru, and I'm 10 years old. I have an adoring and fun-loving brother, and grandma, grandpa as well as mom and dad.

I was born on July 21, 2008, stricken with cerebral palsy after birth. When I was at eleven months old, my mom took it upon herself paving the way for my rehabilitation, and my dad took up the burdens of the entire family. We used up his meager wage to cover all expenses, including the cost of my rehabilitation therapy. I was in poor health then and I often came down with cold, fever and asthma. My mom used to carry me on her back by herself to see the doctors in the hospital. As I was always sick, on medication or under IV, my motor ability was quite poor. I failed to walk on my own during the prime rehabilitation period, as I needed the aid of walkers.

Up until 2015 when my mom planned to send me to live under the care of my grandma. She needed a job and she could no longer accompany me to the rehabilitation. She did not give up on me, however, as she contacted the Silver Lining enrollment hotline. Then we received a call to ask me to go in for an evaluation. After the final evaluation, I joined the extended family of Silver Lining Family to begin my rehabilitation training. After five months of training, there are discernible improvements in my language skills. I can use the bathroom on my own, and I can read and write in simple strokes while making progress in my motor skills.

I've received four years of Silver Lining education since 2015. Now I'm able to write many characters, to memorize, copy and read aloud the textbooks. From not knowing the arithmetic to learning how to add, subtract, multiply and divide, I'm also capable of journaling and essay writing.

When I was young I remembered often watching mom making cross-stitch, and she even made me a love pillow. Now I'm all grown up, I ask her to teach me all kinds of needlework. She wasn't on board initially as she was concerned that I might get a poke while handling the needle. Once upon a time, a button came off the clothing, I tried to sew it back myself, but it ended up getting my finger bloodied by the needle. When my mom saw it, she asked me right away to put down the needle and thread, and she would finish the sewing. I did not acquiesce, however, as I insisted to finish it by myself, and then I really did it. Mom praised my work once she saw the sewed button! I'm learning cross-stitch from her every day, and I hope to become a costume designer in the future!

Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center - Xiuxiu's Mom

I have a family that fell on hard luck, yet it was also a happy family. It's hard luck because my daughter was stricken with cerebral palsy, yet I'm happy it's a warm family. My daughter Xiuxiu suffered from oxygen deprivation to her brain at birth leading to cerebral palsy. At that time, I didn't have any idea of what happened to her only knowing that she was sick. I carried her to a different hospital for treatment that failed to work, then I moved her to another one. Unfortunately, her condition did not improve. At six months old, she still could neither look up nor sit. I kept wondering why my daughter would end up that way? I was demoralized by her circumstances. Sometimes I overheard the neighbors' comments saying she was an imbecile, unable to do things at her age and nothing would get through her. People gave us peculiar looks whenever I took my daughter out, as it hurt me deep inside. Some people even suggested that I should abandon her, and those sayings were just heartrending. The child is a part of my life, how can I forsake her!

Xiuxiu's father worked diligently to earn a living for our family of six while I stayed home to take care of the three children and mother–in–law. Since money was tight, we didn't have the means to set up our daughter for rehabilitation. She stayed put at home much to my reluctance, and I wondered if my child had to live like that for the rest of her life. I'm grateful that the community social worker referred Xiuxiu to the Guangxi Silver Lining Center just when everything was so hopeless. We are fortunate to receive from Silver Lining the free rehabilitation training. Nowadays, every morning at six o'clock I carry my daughter on my back. From our home, we walk to the bus stop to take a two–hour ride to the Rehabilitation Center for the training, and we always make it even rain or shine.

After undertaking her training at the Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center, Xiuxiu is making a lot of improvements, with thanks to all the teachers helping her. I know there are still many challenges to my daughter's journey of rehabilitation, but I'll hang in there to walk with the child through the ups and downs together. The mother is the roots and the child is the tree. The seasons and the weather don't matter. Once there are roots, and there's the mother for the hope of the child!
