
Mission Statement: "Your Love changes lives."

Why Myanmar?

In 2011, Silver Lining Family Village was officially established in Dahua county. In the past six years, we have witnessed the growth of the orphans at the Family Village, with uncles and aunts who love them and take care of them like their own children. We noticed that their development is quite different from those growing up in orphanages where they are taken care of in large groups. Children who grow up at a family model orphanage tend to be happier, and receive better development physically, emotionally and spiritually. We therefore wish to utilize our experience from the Family Village in Dahua to help more orphans in other parts of the world.

Two years ago, we started to actively look for suitable locations to build orphanages and people who are willing to take care of orphans. Until February this year, we had an opportunity to visit Myanmar and got to know more about the work locally. We realize there is a great need there. Myanmar, located in Southeast Asia with a population of 55 million, has been suffering from civil wars for over 50 years and the wars are nowhere near the end. Years of fighting have resulted in huge casualties and financial loss, as well as worsening problems of drugs.

Civil wars and drug abuses have cost innocent children their parents. When we first set foot on Myanmar to visit the children, our hearts were very heavy. A boy in front of us lost his father to drugs and his mother passed away due to illness when he was not even two years old. He was only left with his grandmother. Yet, his grandmother was unable to afford his school fee so he had never attended school as a 8-year-old. This was not an isolated case in Myanmar......

Having understood the needs in Myanmar and found the right people to take care of the orphans, we decided to set up a Silver Lining Family Village in Myanmar and continue to adapt the family model here for childcare. We hope the children can feel loved again in this home. We do not only want them to enjoy all-round development physically, emotionally and spiritually, we also want them to develop their own talents and to become a person with compassion, responsibility, good attitudes and values, so that they can contribute to the society and influence the development of Myanmar positively.

Early Setup of the Orphanage

In Myanmar, our first year's target is to form four families in the orphanage, with each taking care of 8 orphans, making a total of 32 children. Since we are unable to receive a large number of orphans at once, we will launch rural areas sponsorship program scheme simultaneously to help orphans who are a bit older to go to school, since there is no free education in Myanmar.

We hope we can raise enough funds to set up an orphanage for 200 children in two years. If you are willing to walk alongside Myanmar's orphans. we invite you to donate and support our work in Myanmar. You may also become a child sponsor to support the livelihood of these children and bring them joy and health!

The Unchanging Mission of Silver Lining

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You are not Alone

A Letter from a Mother to her Daughter with Cerebral Palsy

On Mother's Day, who as a mother wouldn't want to hear "I love you" from her children? Yet, a mother chose to write a long letter to her daughter, with a humble wish that one day she would hear the word "mommy" from her daughter.

My dear daughter Xiaoyun,

Mommy loves you so much, but I just don't know how to tell you. I chose to write a letter to express my love for you. I hope someday you can understand me.

Mom is a village woman and had four kids after getting married. When you were born, we didn't notice anything unusual. Only until four months later, we found that your body had been very soft, but we did not pay attention as we thought you were just still small. When we took you to the doctor, they said it was due to lack of calcium. and that we should give you more calcium and sunlight.

Yet, when you reached nine months old, you still couldn't lift your

head. It was then I realized your issue was serious. We took you for a check-up at the hospital and the result completely broke my heart.....my adorable daughter has cerebral palsy!

Mom has been a tough person, but when I saw you at that time, I was scared! I wanted to end our lives but I could not let go of your siblings. I searched on the internet for successful recovery cases of children with cerebral palsy and felt slightly relieved. And then I took you to Guangzhou hospital for treatment. Seeing you crying hurt my heart! I blamed myself and

Yet, a poor family with a "special" child cannot avoid gossiping by others. Even our relatives told us, "Just give up! Don't burden your family with a disabled child. Your family is not rich and you have three other children to take care of." Every day was torturing to me. To make things worse, at our most difficult time, your dad was diagnosed with lymphoma in 2013 and had to be sent to hospital for treatment, which costed

cerebral palsy, Lactually preferred to use the money to treat your dad. That night, we packed your stuff and was ready to send you away. You were usually quiet but you were crying so hard. My tears kept falling and I cannot let you go! You did nothing wrong and you should not bear all these pain. We are your only family...if you were abandoned, you would become an orphan. All of us cried. Your sister and

brother told me in tears, "Mom, we don't want to abandon our little

sister. However tough it is we want to be with her!"

Sometime later, I heard from a friend about a rehabilitation center named Silver Lining in Guangxi. We soon learned that Silver Lining specializes in providing free rehabilitation training for poor children with cerebral palsy. I immediately took you there. The teachers taught me how to do massage and stretching with you. When other people trained for two hours, I trained for four. I was always the last one to leave the Center! After getting home I had to cook and do chores, as well as training with you. I usually go to bed after midnight.


Every day we repeatedly work on the rehabilitation exercise. You were so tough that you never cried and threw tantrum. I felt mixed seeing you like this! Now you are already six. We have walked alongside you for more than 2,000 nights. From being unable to sit to now being able to sit still, lift your head, tell others when you felt-hungry, as well as expressing with your eyes for communications. Mom is so happy and relieved to see your improvement!

At the age of six, however, you still could not speak. How I wish to hear you call me "mommy".

Doctor told me earlier that your hearing is severely impaired and could only hear sound when

the plane took off. You would have to wear an audio phone or have a cochlear implant, but the cost is high and we could not afford it. But I will not give up! I still believe you can hear one day and call me "mommy"!

very little income. Yet, I am the only financial support for our family. My wife takes care of Xiaoyun in Nanning and our other three children can only take care of themselves at home.



Relations in Families having Children with Cerebral Palsy

Every May and June, many people would celebrate Mother's Day and Father's Day. On these special days, sons and daughters will usually make time and plans to express their gratitude towards parents. These celebrations are surely sweet and heartwarming. Yet, to cultivate and nurture good family relations in the long run, day-to-day communications and interactions are much more important.

Parent-child relation is an important bond in a family, and their intimacy would affect the overall harmony in the family. Parents of children with cerebral palsy have to face unusual challenges in daily life. These challenges often create living and psychological pressure which directly and indirectly influences the family relationship. Due to the uniqueness of children with cerebral palsy, they have a strong need for a stable and healthy family where each family member can find enough support.



At Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center in Guangxi, most of the children with cerebral palsy are taken care of by their mother. Due to their special situation, the mothers are constantly worried about their health issues and physical development. Many are concerned that the children cannot walk properly and will have to face many obstacles in life later. All these worries have kept them from discovering other sides of their children. For the dads, most of them are away from home to make a living and cannot stay with their children, let alone growing up with them. To strengthen and improve these families' relationship, Silver Lining organized a three-day parent-child camp in Beihai, Guangxi, for them to spend some quality time with each other.

In this camp, we introduced some fun games to the children and parents. For example, the parents had to wear an eye mask on the beach and to look for their own children. With beautiful weather and the endless ocean, parents were able to temporarily leave behind all the burdens and focused on having fun with their children at the beach. Look at the beautiful smiles on their faces!





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Workshops for Parents and Children

Though the parents are interacting with their children all the time, it does not mean they know how to get along with them. Every day, the mothers have to attend rehabilitation training with their children, and when they get home, besides keep up with the training at home they also have to manage the housework. They are so occupied that they never really have breaks to enjoy their time with children. Sometimes, they would channel their pressure and emotions onto their children without even realizing it.

Through the workshops in this camp, the parents have learnt how to love and accept themselves and their children, as well as ways to create quality family time, develop healthy emotions and teach their children, etc. Parents were able to better understand themselves, their own problems and limitations. The workshops were fruitful and they had a chance to respond to each other's sharing. On the other hand, children and parents made some crafts together during the craft session, which not only brings back some childhood memories of the parents but also provides a good opportunity for the children to express their creativity.

At the closing ceremony, some children with cerebral palsy sang a song called "When you turns old" for their parents. Though they were unable to sing the lyrics clearly or follow the rhythm, that was not important at all. Watching the children on stage singing with their best effort, everyone in the room were deeply moved and many parents were in tears.

Besides that, a special video was filmed for the parents. In the video, the children were asked, "One day when mom and dad turn old, what would you do?"

"They will never get old!" A boy answered innocently. Some other answered, "I hope I am healthy. So I can take care of you." "I will take care of you! I will eat with you and wash dishes for you." "I will learn to walk now. When I can walk, I will cook for mom and dad."

"I didn't know our children can be so understanding and mature. I am deeply moved. I will never give up our own children!" "My dear child, mom and dad will always walk with you......" After hearing their children's singing and watching the video, all moms and dads couldn't wait to express their love to their children and many were hugging each other. It was a very touching scene!

It is true that the path to recovery for every child with cerebral palsy is long and winding. However, with the unceasing love from parents, though full of challenges, the path is still filled with strength and hope!

After graduating from university, supposedly I should take the path to medical profession according to my parents' arrangement. However, after encountering rural villages and poverty development, I found that it is more meaningful to help children in rural areas. When seeing improvement in their situation, it fuels my passion and motivation at work.



Tough Route will never Deter Steps Forward

Since my entrance to the charity profession in 2003, I spent most of the time in villages and rural area. I still remember the first time going to the rural: Taking a two-hour bus from the city to a town, and walked another two hours onto the hill. We did not see any people on our way and the cliff was steep. The mountain was infertile and we could not see any signs of life. At that moment, I started to doubt my choice, I wanted to cry and I missed home! Yet, when I remembered my decision and determination, I regained my motivation to press on. Soon after, a small village appeared in front of me. The school I had to go to was near. And that's where everything started...

In the following five years, the work of Silver Lining was gradually established. We have launched service in different villages in Guangxi mountainous areas, attending to village children's health and education, taking care of the minorities including disabled orphans. Our service scope was slowly widening.



Realising Rural Children's Dream to Education

One time we were on our way to a village visit, I met a skinny girl who was around 10 years old. The village representative told me. "That girl cannot see. She's an orphan. Her dad passed away and her mother married someone else; The girl only has her grandma. She once told me, 'I want to go to school. Can you help me?" Knowing the girl wants to study, we really want to help. After communicating with a school with special education, the girl finally has a chance to leave the rural area and receive education in school. Later, she finished junior high school. In these few years, Silver Lining has encountered many similar cases. Seeing that our work help brings these children out of poverty, that they may embrace their own future, it strengthens my determination to continue serving orphans and disabled children.



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Serving Children in Difficulty with Professionalism and Sincerity

In 2009, Silver Lining was planning to build an orphanage based on family model in Dahua county. Dahua's natural resources are not desirable. The geographical feature is poor and transport is extremely inconvenient. It is not an easy task to lift local residents out of poverty. In Dahua, many children become orphans when their fathers pass away or mothers re-marry. However, it is hard to take in a large number of orphans in a family model orphanage, and there are still many orphans being left struggling in the village.

Silver Lining project staff visited many villages to collect cases and build up a case intervention and follow-up system. When a child is sick, we will take the child with their guardian to see the doctor and provide treatment. Silver Lining

also sets up a "Home for Children's Growth" in the community, so that the orphans can gain support emotionally as well in their study.

In 2011, we start attending the needs of disabled children. Many people see disability as an illness and the society is lacking acceptance and inclusiveness. Silver Lining has launched projects including rehabilitation education, social engagement, and disabled children's family support in order to normalize disabled children's rehabilitation. It also helps to facilitate a more inclusive society. The happiest moment in my work at Silver Lining is when I am with the children, and the most valuable thing is to enjoy happiness at work!

Thank to Silver Lining for giving us a chance to visit the rehabilitation center for children with cerebral palsy, pay home visits and join the Beihai family camp. It was a valuable lesson for us all and we have learnt how to give and experience more love and grace.

There is only one reason for me to join this visit. It was to respond to God's call. I believe that we will receive more than we give because God loves these children. As long as are willing to step out, we will definitely see what God has done for Silver Lining.

On the first day we arrived at the Center, we were already touched by the children's innocence, the parents' persistence and the teachers' passion! Before we entered the classroom, one of the children already came to shake hands with us and welcomed us. During the training, parents and children were all focused on the teacher's instructions. A simple act like waving or making a step is not simple to them.







After class, we proceeded to home visit. It was a very good opportunity for us to understand their daily life. Though facing difficulties every day, parents would motivate and support each other. Together with the help from Silver Lining, they found hope in despair.

In the three-day family camp, our group split into five small teams and organized different activities and talks in the camp. These three days have become a beautiful memory for us and the children and parents at Nanning. We only have one wish, and that is to bring love to everyone. The most heartwarming part was to see their innocent smiles on the beach. It really melted our hearts!

On our last day, we did some sharing and exchange at the closing ceremony. We sincerely hope for the best for the children, parents and staff at Silver Lining and hope we will keep in touch in the future.

It is a valuable chance for my whole family, from young to old, to participate in this event. Everyone gave their best in their roles. I was blessed to see my daughter who learnt to respect and cherish life through the beautiful witness of the children and parents. I hope everyone will keep their hopes up and continue to influence each other's lives!

Never give up (Lau Lai-ling)

Before we took off, since we had to prepare some games for the camp, I tried to imagine the ability of the children with cerebral palsy and the obstacles faced by their parents. I tried to picture the heaviness of the parents and wondered what I could say to encourage them.

I remember on the first day we arrived at the Center, we sat in their training and saw the teacher instructing their motions, "Raise your left leg...raise your right arm...." It sounds easy to us but not for the children there. But with their parents' help, every child tried their best to finish the moves. It was a beautiful scene!



In the following days, we joined the Beihai family camp. Through spending time and playing games with each other. I found that most parents are positive and pleasant. I wondered why they are happier than us given they have to take intensive care of their children every day? A mother told me one night at the dinner, "At Silver Lining, there is nothing to compare since we are pretty much the same. We just help each other out." Their encouraging attitude is a good example for us.

Since the children cannot control their limbs very well. they need to wear a feet aid to help them walk. Most of the time they will fall. When I wanted to lift them



up, the parents would only ask them to try getting up by themselves. It is for their own good. Lydia (one of the founders) said one of the children told her he isn't afraid of pain, when he falls he just gets back up..... The children would become stronger when they climb with their own strength.

At the final closing ceremony, a group of children sang a song called "when you turn old" for the parents. It reminded me of the first day of class that their hard work was for one day when they can take care of their own parents. It moved me deeply because it was love! The love I saw was from the parents to their children, who wear a big smile because of the love they experience. Parents also experience love from Silver Lining, where there are teachers, staff, and supporters with a love heart.

I am really blessed to be able to join this journey. I thought I had to encourage the children and parents but it was the other way around. It makes me understand that giving up is easy but to persist is difficult. Yet, with Silver Lining, a place filled with love and people who would never give up on any parent or child who keeps trying, I see many smiling faces with joy and thanksgiving!

Give Wings to Dream

In Nanning, I see dreams, Dreams that I wanted to give a pair of wings to.

In this visit, our team introduced a mini game to the children and parents called "Tree of Wish". We want them to write down their wishes and place it onto the Tree.

When the game started, we saw the parents struggling to think about their dreams. In fact, we never told them the wish may come true after placing it on the tree, but they took the game seriously and wrote down all their wishes. They think and write and make corrections to what they wrote. In the process. I saw that they didn't treat it as a game only, they expressed everything in their heart, their dreams and their expectations towards their children.

Watching them placing their dreams on the Tree one by one, dreams that sounds simple but not at all easy for themI couldn't hold my tears.

The dream of Gege (a child with cerebral palsy) is to walk. Others' include driving, taking care of brother. working in a factory, doing what he wants to do, going on a spontaneous trip, etc.



They may not be able to walk; may not be able to take public transport. They are being taken cared of but wish to take care of others. They are just like us who wanted to do their own things. They wanted to go travel but is tied up by reality just like us - maybe due to work or just life.

Is it simple? Yes; Is it easy? Not at all. When my eyes were still filled with tears. I lifted my head and saw them all happy and energetic as they put their cards of wishes onto the Tree, all feeling satisfied at their seat. That moment I was ashamed of myself. Why should I pity them? Though their dreams have not come true vet, their soul is changing unnoticeably.

Although I don't feel I have done much for them in this short visit. I feel like we are like a tunnel, for them to walk through and wait with hope. The light on the other side of the tunnel would be the love of God. shining over our path and give us confidence and strength to press on.




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Introduction of Lower Limb Orthosis for Children with Cerebral Palsy

Before this year's Lunar New Year, I visited Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center in Guangxi for the first time This visit was mainly for meeting with the teacher and therapist, understanding what the children need in terms of special aid, as well as providing treatment for several difficult cases. Most importantly, I met Mr. Pan, who make orthosis for the children so we can exchange our ideas and techniques.

Though there is not the most advanced medical device, every smile on the children's faces and the active participation from parents, teachers and staff devotion has attracted me. I know the path for Silver Lining since its establishment in 2005 was never easy. Yet, having a dream in heart makes the road easier. My best wish to Silver Lining!

I will introduce several common orthosis and explain their design below:

Orthosis is an external device to help improving nerves, muscle and skeletal systems' function and structure. It is common for children with cerebral palsy to have lower limb articular contracture and distortion, leading to peculiar posture, malfunction, step deviation, etc. Yet, the use of orthosis would replace the lost function of children with cerebral palsy with human engineering to improve their walking and self-control ability.

Lower limb orthosis usually has the following function: to control muscle tension and movement mode, to restrict involuntary movements and reduce undesirable reflexes, avoiding unusual joint activities and limit motion area. It also avoids and fixes distortion, replacing some of the lost functions. When in action, it helps to provide stable foundation and facilitate treatment and training's outcome, aiming to improve walking posture ultimately. Besides, orthosis can also help strengthening the training.

Polyethylene or Polypropylene is the common material used to make the lower limb orthosis. Its advantage is being light, easy to clean and durable. Depending on the treatment goal, it can be differentiated into fixed and joint design. Common orthosis include:

(1) UCBL Foot Orthosis and Supra-malleolar orthosis (SMO)

Fixed design is most commonly used. Its function is to stabilize and maintain the feet bone's position and alignment, fixing or supporting platy podia, improving extroversion or inversion, reducing muscle tension and uplift of heels. This kind of orthosis has to be placed inside shoes, sandals or flip flops are not advised.



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(2) Ankle Foot Orthosis (AFO)

Most children with cerebral palsy would use AFO. There are many designs and the most common one is Ankle Foot Orthosis. It is able to fix the ankle joint to a default position and the angle depends on the child's knee joint's position when they walk: when squatting, the angle is larger and vice versa. This AFO can help fixing spasticity, inversion and extroversion, as well as to stretch the muscle on the back of calf and avoid triceps contracture. By fixing the ankles, it can strengthen stability of lower limbs.

(RAFO)



AFO is only suitable for children who have comparatively normal plantar flexion and dorsiflexion and those calves were not over tense, or it may cause knee joints squatting posture in long term. Its benefits include helping the kids to stand from sitting position, to squat and to walk up and downs on stairs, helping them to have a more natural posture.

(HAFO)

The top of GAFO is needed to be pressed in the lower half of patella or on the patellar ligament. Its main function is to push calves towards the back when the feet are placing flat using ground reaction force to avoid squatting; when the ankles lifted up it pushed the knee backward to avoid bending the knees. This kind of orthosis is not suitable for children whose knee joints are stretched out and is inconvenient for them, particularly difficult for them to stand up from the seat.

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(GAFO)

(3) KAFO

KAFO is not for children with cerebral palsy to walk. Its function is to help keeping the knee joints stretched, avoid contracture as well as to control ankle sagging and inversion issues. Prescription of orthosis has to depend on the child's situation and treatment goals. When using the orthosis parents should have enough communications with therapist and orthotist to make good use of orthosis.





For children with cerebral palsy, it is important to have suitable rehabilitation training as early as possible, and to provide timely medical help and device aid. These help is crucial to their development and growth.

Last year, Jingjing (a child at Silver Lining) received an operation at the University of Hong Kong Shenzhen Hospital through Cornerstone's scheme and received rehabilitation training two months after the surgery. After returning to Nanning, Silver Lining continues to provide frequent rehabilitation training to Jingjing and found a suitable orthosis and walking aid for her. After over three months of practice, Jingjing can already use a walker to walk by herself and her posture is much nicer and more stable! Now she starts to learn standing by herself.
