Our Services

Silver Lining launched its poverty relief operation in Guangxi, China in 2005, committed to helping the impoverished ethnic minorities and orphans in the rural mountain areas by sponsoring their education and improving their living standards. Also, we provide rehabilitation training and education for children with cerebral palsy, offering employment opportunities to women and people with disabilities, and emergency medical assistance to children that came down with an illness. We assist and care for children in distress, the migrant children, and those left behind children. The children will also receive our character education program. Beginning in 2017, we expanded our services to Myanmar to provide aids to orphans and children who have cerebral palsy. The Vietnam Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center is also formally in service in 2019. Through our love and actions, we hope more people in need of assistance will receive care and blessings, which will improve their lives and restore their dignity and hope.

Silver Lining Missions not only provides practical assistance to children with special needs and their families through acts of love, but also demonstrates the beautiful results of "giving fish and teaching fishing" through professional holistic care and guidance, practicing the principle of life influencing life.

Guangxi Silver Lining Social Work Service Center (referred to as Guangxi Silver Lining) has been the organization supported by Silver Lining Missions since its establishment in 2013. From serving just over ten children with cerebral palsy to over 180 by 2022, Guangxi Silver Lining has not only seen an increase in the number of beneficiaries but also became an internship base for Nanning Normal University in 2022. Furthermore, in August 2022, it was invited by the Nanning Disabled Persons Federation to operate a demonstration site for public welfare rehabilitation assistance for disabled children in Nanning City, promoting the core values, service philosophy, and principles of Silver Lining Missions. The "Silver Lining Charity Golf Event" and the "Silver Lining x Shang Hai Commercial Bank Charity Bowling Tournament" in 2022 were fundraising activities for the construction of a new rehabilitation center and the update of treatment equipment for Guangxi Silver Lining. We express our gratitude to the 220 participants and generous supporters behind these two charity events. Your loving donations perfectly embody the beautiful results of "giving fish and teaching fishing."





The orphan project of Guangxi Dahua Care Center also brought good news in 2022, with seven high school graduates being admitted to universities and another student advancing from vocational school to university. Since high school, they have volunteered at Guangxi Silver Lining during winter and summer vacations, assisting their "siblings" with cerebral palsy and learning to serve those in need. The Silver Lining Orphan Project not only provides children with basic needs and concerns for their physical well-being but also focuses on their development in terms of their hearts, society, and spirits. We firmly believe that they will succeed after graduating from university and enter the field of social work, where they can not only become self-reliant but also testify to a life of love by loving others. As sponsors of Silver Lining Missions, witnessing the growth of these young people and experiencing the wonderful results of "giving fish and teaching fishing" is truly a joy.





Myanmar is another place that Silver Lining Missions cares for and serves. In 2022, we distributed relief supplies seven times to help families in desperate situations. Despite the turbulent times in Myanmar, we are grateful that Myanmar Silver Lining Family Village was able to pass through 2022 peacefully and even expanded its facilities to accommodate 200 children. These children, who have lost their families, receive care and love in the Silver Lining Family Village, and the co-worker Josh of Silver Lining Missions initiated the Dare to Dream (D2D) project, inspiring the children in the home to dare to dream and break free from their past hardships. We are delighted to see that this group of once-shy children has become confident. In 2022, they established five D2D groups: basketball, dance, cooking, painting, and singing.

In the second half of 2022, as the COVID-19 pandemic eased, co-workers Josh, Chris, and Lydia of Silver Lining Missions continued their visits to Myanmar Silver Lining Family Village, Eden Centre in Yangon, and Sllver Lining rehabilitation center in Hanoi, Vietnam, to encourage local coworkers and children, responding to the growing demand for services. In December, during the Silver Lining Fundraising Dinner, Josh and Lydia shared the challenges and rewards they encountered. We





are deeply grateful for the enthusiastic response and support from the attendees of the dinner.

Yearly reviews always bring surprises, and 2022 was no exception. The "surprise" was the sudden call to serve orphans in Vietnam and Indonesia, and the "joy" was counting the achievements of the "giving fish and teaching fishing" projects served by Silver Lining Missions. Co-workers Chris and Lydia firmly believe that our "surprises" will turn into "joy" in the coming year because of you - Silver Lining friends - who walk alongside us and support us. You are the driving force that propels Silver Lining Missions forward!





A Home for Orphans

Nanning Silver Lining Caring Center



Dahua Silver Lining Caring Center launched the "A Home for Orphans" project in 2009, aiming to provide care services to local orphans, left-behind children, and children with disabilities in a "family" model. The services of the caring center are based on four main objectives, including ensuring the healthy growth of mountain orphans and disadvantaged children, providing them with educational opportunities, offering appropriate care, protection, and participation, and instilling in them the values of loving others as themselves and their neighbors. Over the past year, the center has achieved these objectives through various activities and successfully provided services to 104 orphans from 7 families.

In 2022, with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the care center has implemented multiple preventive measures to ensure that the children receive sufficient and balanced nutrition and can grow up in a healthy manner. The center continues to provide education for the children and nurtures their interests through diverse growth groups, enabling them to have a balanced and joyful upbringing. In addition to acquiring knowledge, the center also emphasizes the cultivation of good character and therefore arranges "character classes" for the children. Regular family days are also organized to ensure that the children can build self-esteem and confidence in a loving environment.

Beneficiaries

Since 2017, with the support of the local community in Myanmar, Silver Lining Missions has established the Pyin Oo Lwin Silver Lining Family Village, which adopts the model of cottage families to care for orphans. Each family is managed by one caregiver who looks after 10 children, allowing them to experience the warmth of a family again. As of the end of 2022, the "A Home for Orphans" foster care program has helped 16 families and a total of 174 children in the local community.

Silver Lining Family Village upholds the goal of providing children with a healthy upbringing. Despite the lack of piped water in Pyin Oo Lwin, they have installed water purifiers to ensure clean drinking water for the children. The Amazing Grace Academy School established by Silver Lining Family Village has enrolled 46 children from the community, allowing them to continue learning both Chinese and Burmese languages. They have also introduced interest groups to prepare the children for their future involvement in society. Silver Lining Family Village organizes various summer camps and themed activities to cultivate the children's proper values and enhance their relationships with each other. To ensure the safety of the children, Silver Lining Family Village has also strengthened campus security and educated the children on self-protection.

Foster Care Family





Beneficiaries

Thanks to the support of local couples in Lashio and Namsang, Silver Lining Missions has been able to help numerous orphans in both locations, providing them with food, shelter, education, and other forms of care. As of 2022, there were 10 beneficiaries in Namsang and 7 beneficiaries in Lashio.

Due to the ongoing impact of the pandemic and the unstable international situation, the cost of living in Myanmar remains uncertain. However, with the efforts of Silver Lining, foster children in both locations can grow up in a healthy environment with sufficient nutrition. Through remote learning, foster children can continue their education at home, avoiding the loss of learning opportunities due to environmental factors. The caregivers of foster families have received education and training to nurture children with care, appreciation, acceptance, and other important values, allowing them to grow up in a positive environment. Regular parent-child activities are also conducted to increase the involvement of children in the family and enhance their emotional bonds with each other.

Nanning Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center divides children with cerebral palsy into two groups: the preschool group and the adolescent group. This division allows the center to provide more effective rehabilitation, education, and integrated services tailored to their specific needs, enabling them to become capable of integrating into society. In addition to face—to—face classes, the center also offers remote classes to benefit more children and families. In 2022, the center provided services to 270 special—needs children.

The range of rehabilitation services provided by the center extends beyond basic life skills. Through various forms such as games and classes, the center trains children in motor skills, cultivates their learning interests, provides language and character education, and equips them with employment skills. For families with disabled children facing difficulties, the center not only organizes professional teams to visit and provide home-based training guidance, but also offers financial support and organizes various relaxation activities to help parents reduce life stress and focus on caring for their children. To promote better understanding and acceptance of disabled children in society, the center also arranges outdoor activities for them, enhancing their adaptive abilities and allowing them to experience the warmth of society, fostering social inclusion.

Beneficiaries

The Yangon Eden Center for Disabled Children has been providing services for disabled children for over 20 years. Yuncai has been in contact with the center since 2017 and introduced a guided education model. In 2022, the center continued to provide rehabilitation services for children, helping them integrate into society. A total of 100 children benefited from these services.

The center offers various rehabilitation training programs to allow children to stretch their bodies and cultivate their learning interests. Some children have successfully enrolled in Burmese primary schools, integrating into society. The staff at the center continuously assess the children's rehabilitation and educational progress and revise rehabilitation goals according to their abilities, ensuring that the children make improvements in their capabilities. The families of these children face various pressures in raising them. Therefore, the center provides them with supplies and guidance on making rehabilitation aids. They also offer remote classes to teach parents how to conduct rehabilitation training at home.

Beneficiaries

Located in Hanoi, the Vietnam Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center primarily serves children with cerebral palsy and special needs. It provides rehabilitation support through a guided education model, while also aiming to educate the public and promote acceptance and understanding of disabled children. As of 2022, the center has served 20 children with cerebral palsy.

Through participation in rehabilitation classes designed by tutors and professionals, the children at the center can gradually exercise their muscles. The rehabilitation progress has also been successfully showcased to the public. The children have participated in various sports competitions and games during outdoor activities, not only experiencing the joy of sports but also receiving support from society. This encourages both the children and their parents to integrate into society. During the year-end assessment, the center's staff discovered that the children's rehabilitation and educational progress far exceeded expectations, indicating that the cooperation between families and the center has greatly contributed to the children's rehabilitation. The center also pays attention to the stress experienced by parents and organizes group activities to allow them to exchange caregiving experiences and support each other.

Guangxi Nanning primarily serves the city's mobile children, who relocate to different places with their parents' work. Throughout their growth, these children face challenges such as lack of care and family support, educational instability, and safety concerns. Yuncai Action provides diversified services to address the difficulties and problems they encounter in their lives and growth.

To provide a safe space for the children, Silver Lining Missions establishes activity centers and libraries in their residential areas. These facilities offer a secure place for children to learn and play. The centers also organize various activity groups, supported by university student volunteers. The children not only learn through play but also feel the care and support from the outside world. The university students serve as role models, encouraging the children to strive for academic success and develop a helpful and compassionate character. Recognizing the lack of parentchild relationships in mobile families, the center also organizes various types of parent-child activities to promote communication and bonding within the families in need.

Student Care Center for Youth in Troubled





Beneficiaries

The Student Grace Youth Center primarily serves underprivileged children from various regions in Myanmar. Currently, it caters to 55 students and provides a stable and safe living environment, meals, daily necessities, as well as health and educational support. The center also aims to encourage the students to continue their education after graduation, preparing them to contribute back to society in the future.

Due to the unstable cost of living in Myanmar, the center ensures the children's healthy growth by providing vaccinations and nutritional support. As the target beneficiaries are predominantly Chinese children, the center offers education in both Burmese and Chinese languages, aiming to improve their future employment opportunities and empowering them to break free from poverty.

PROJECT NAME

Yangon Youth Center (PYCC)

The Yangon Youth Center (PYCC) started preparations in 2019, and by mid-2020, students began enrolling. The center primarily serves underprivileged students who are dedicated to their studies in the local area, with approximately 20 students. The center's director has had experience managing students during his studies abroad. He supports the assisted students in attending nearby Burmese schools until graduation, encourages them to pursue higher education or acquire vocational skills, and ultimately contribute back to society.

The center also provides vaccinations for the children and establishes regular daily routines to ensure their healthy growth. For students preparing for university, the center offers learning support, including assistance in subject selection, mental counseling, and leadership training. The goal is to encourage the children to strive for their dreams through diligent studies. The children can also participate in various activities organized by the center to relieve academic pressure and promote their diversified development.

Nanweng Silver Lining Puyi School

Nanweng Yuncai Puyi School is a Chinese school funded by Yuncai Action. Its aim is to provide quality free education to more children in need, allowing them to learn Chinese and enhance their future competitiveness. Currently, the school serves over 200 students. The project supports the school's infrastructure and facilities, including classrooms, student dormitories, sports fields, and meals for students.

As many students come from remote areas to attend school, the school has used Yuncai's funding to construct student dormitories. It also provides financial support for students from disadvantaged backgrounds to cover their living expenses, ensuring that they do not miss out on educational opportunities due to poverty. Despite limited human resources, the school makes efforts to offer four core subjects and remote classes to students. Additionally, the school emphasizes the students' emotional growth and character education, organizing various themed activities to enrich their inner development.

Due to the disruptions caused by the pandemic, many impoverished families in the local area have lost their jobs, further affecting their economic situation. Yuncai Action, on the other hand, provides assistance to children affected by the pandemic by supplying them with essential living supplies. The aim is to alleviate the financial pressure on families and ensure that children's educational opportunities are not compromised

In 2022, Myanmar continued to face instability in domestic affairs, currency depreciation, and the COVID-19 pandemic, which placed heavy pressure on the families served by the Eden Disabled Children Center due to the high cost of daily necessities. In order to support low-income families with disabled children, Silver Lining Missions responded to the varying needs of the center and carried out multiple emergency food relief assistance activities throughout 2022, aiming to alleviate the living costs and pressures of low-income families. A total of 1,310 households benefited from these efforts.

Meanwhile, the Yangon Youth Care Center located in Yangon faced further economic strain due to the price inflation caused by the flooding in August. The center served impoverished families whose living pressures were significantly increased. Therefore, Silver Lining Missions intensified its emergency relief activities to help low-income families overcome the challenges in their lives and ensure that children in need do not miss out on their rehabilitation training while their parents are away for work. A total of 40 households benefited from these efforts.

Vocational education for disabled youth

Silver Lining has been assisting disabled youth in preparing for employment and integration into society. Through collaboration with the "Bai Xin Youth Program," Yuncai provides courses in graphic design, e-commerce, programming, and more for the youth. Additionally, Silver Lining's social workers develop career development plans tailored to their physical conditions, skills, and personal preferences. They also establish connections with different companies to provide internship opportunities. This year, two disabled youth successfully completed external internships, taking their first steps towards future social engagement.

Vocational skill support for orphanage

The staff and teachers in Myanmar organize career planning groups for children and arrange one-onone consultations to help children understand their vocational interests, acquire knowledge of life skills training, and assess their academic abilities. To enhance their competitiveness for future social integration, Silver Lining encourages them to learn both Chinese and Burmese languages. To ensure effective learning outcomes, tutors regularly communicate with the children and provide academic support.

Lifelong learning is a challenge that disadvantaged children often face. Yuncai understands that having a positive mindset is crucial for children to persevere through adversity. Guangxi Yuncai utilizes various character education classes, story discussions, thematic activities, and more to teach children to develop good character traits and cultivate a positive mindset. They also establish a "Character of the Month" program to promote children's progress and encourage mutual influence and growth among peers. At Dahua Yuncai, social workers tailor the teaching of correct values to children's physical and mental development through daily life experiences. Yuncai's caregivers actively participate in character education, extending the education into the family environment.

HAKHA Student Center (HCC)









Beneficiaries

In 2022, children in Myanmar continued to endure their childhood amidst conflict and turmoil. In light of this, Silver Lining Missions decided to establish the HAKHA Student Center (HCC) in the mountainous region of Hakha, Myanmar. The center aims to provide education for children aged 9 to 12 who are in need. Following a comprehensive care approach, the HCC covers both educational and daily living needs of the children, with the goal of nurturing them into individuals who can contribute to society.

Currently, the HCC serves a total of 15 students who have also taken up residence in the center. Three local staff members provide comprehensive care, ensuring their daily routines are structured and their lives are regulated. Additionally, the students receive academic tutoring and grow up in a safe environment.

As a newly established center, the children face significant changes in leaving their homes, and adjusting their emotions becomes an important aspect. The center employs an encouraging approach to help them regulate their emotions. Many of these children come from areas close to armed conflicts, and as such, the center is committed to providing them with a stable educational opportunity and environment. Interesting activities are organized to stimulate their desire for knowledge.

Given that the HCC is located in the mountainous region of Myanmar, with numerous military checkpoints nearby and limited transportation, the cost of living has increased. Moreover, military conflicts often occur, resulting in many children living in unstable conditions and losing opportunities for education. Therefore, Silver Lining Missions hopes to expand the HCC's service capacity to accommodate 30 students, allowing more impoverished children with a thirst for knowledge to continue growing steadfastly even amidst turbulent circumstances.

In 2022, our incoming fund received a total of approximately \$1.34 million. We are very grateful that regular donations are 36%, corporate and organization donations 15%, and individual donations is 46%. In 2022, we didn't have many opportunities to organize fundraising event in US because the COVID-19 was still very severe at that time. Our incoming fund is below our budget, but our expenditure is also under our budget too. It ended up that our incoming fund is more than our expenditure in general.


In 2022, the actual expenditure was about 974 thousand in total. Despite the difficulties in the field, we have tried our best to respond the demand of Hakha City in Myanmar. We added a Hakha Children's Center to help the children who are in difficult situations and severely affected by war. Some of the children come from the refugee camps in the Chin State. Orphan programs and special needs children programs are 27% and 23% respectively. Administrative and fundraising are only 2% and 3% respectively. We have 95% of the total expenditure is directly invested in the field services and benefits for the orphans and special need children. We have increased good number of orphans in our Family Village in Myanmar this year. As a result, our orphanage expenditure has increased too. But thankful that we can also provide a shelter and food for these children who are experience great suffering from poverty, war, and pandemics.

We are very grateful for your donations. We understand that your donation come with love to the children and hope to change the lives of these children. We value and cherish your donation greatly and will ensure every dollar used efficiently and properly. We will do our best to bring the hope of change to these children. 
