Our Services

Silver Lining launched its poverty relief operation in Guangxi, China in 2005, committed to helping the impoverished ethnic minorities and orphans in the rural mountain areas by sponsoring their education and improving their living standards. Also, we provide rehabilitation training and education for children with cerebral palsy, offering employment opportunities to women and people with disabilities, and emergency medical assistance to children that came down with an illness. We assist and care for children in distress, the migrant children, and those left behind children. The children will also receive our character education program. Beginning in 2017, we expanded our services to Myanmar to provide aids to orphans and children who have cerebral palsy. The Vietnam Silver Lining Rehabilitation Center is also formally in service in 2019. Through our love and actions, we hope more people in need of assistance will receive care and blessings, which will improve their lives and restore their dignity and hope.

The New Coronavirus, invisible to the eye and untouchable by the hands, is so infectious that it threatens the world and calls for no one to bow down. However, in 2021, Silver Lining Missions will continue to witness an infection stronger than the New Coronavirus – The Power of Love! We are extremely grateful to those friends and organizations who share the mission of the Silver Lining and continue to walk with the Silver Lining Missions regardless of the external gloomy environment, bringing a cup of cool water to the less fortunate in need and relieving their urgent needs.

The Silver Lining Charity Golf Tournament on July 29, 2021, the Shanghai Business x Clouds Charity Basketball Invitational Tournament on November 14th, 2021, and the One Shared of Sky Charity Dinner on December 7th, 2021 were not only held as scheduled but also carried out in a physical manner, with more teams and participants than we expected, all by grace! We value every bit of donation from our friends who support Silver Lining Missions, and we value even more the participation of our friends who support Silver Lining Missions with all their hearts. You came to hear more from Chris and Lydia about the children and families in Family Village. We can't afford to be disappointed by the passionate and sincere support of all of you.

In 2021, in turbulent Myanmar, the Family Village was able to preserve health, livelihood, and learning. With the love of our supporters and the guidance of medical professionals, we strengthened our co-workers' awareness and stockpiled medical supplies and food in advance when the epidemic had just begun and the social environment was unstable. When the epidemic was severe, 150 children and caregivers were infected, but all of them recovered in the end! On the other hand, the schools in Myanmar were closed, but the HouEn School in the Family Village continued to hold classes every day. Emergency relief supplies were distributed 10 times in the slums of Yangon by local co-workers and teachers from EDEN Center, providing relief to over 100 families and giving them a sense of human warmth.

As 2021 came to a close, the needs of post-turmoil Burma became more apparent – Silver Lining Missions received many requests to take in orphans, longing for more "Family Village" to provide them with a warm home. Our hearts go out to these children who have no one to turn to, and as we look toward 2022, the challenges of serving in Myanmar will be even greater.

In Guangxi, we are pleased to see that the work of the Guangxi Silver Lining Service Center and Dahua Care

Center, supported by Silver Lining Missions for more than a decade, has benefited many disabled children, orphans, and special-needs families, breaking through local perceptions of the disadvantaged. In 2021, Fu Gang, De Wang, and Li Shu, who grew up in the Silver Lining Service Center, found jobs, and they were all able to use their abilities in a work environment: making promotional videos for an automobile company, and serving in a restaurant, and working as a security. The whole-person development of children, which has always been the focus of the Silver Lining Service Center, is finally paying off. At present, there are still 20 disabled youths in Service Center to be prepared for employment. The challenges they face are no less: the limitation of the child's limbs, the difficulty of traveling, but also the challenges of the workplace environment and interpersonal skills. Despite the hardships, the co-workers at the Service Center stay on course and look forward to the integration of more young people like Fu Gang, De Wang, and Li Shu into society.

The Dahua Care Center provides a home for orphans by providing care for them and focusing on character development and life-building. In 2021, we were happy to see three of our students graduate; some went on to pursue undergraduate studies and some found jobs. In 2021, five children went to university, which is a great honor in the local countryside! The children know this because of the loving sponsors behind them, watching over them and encouraging them. In Dahua, many left-behind children, orphans, and children are in difficulty outside of the Care Center. In addition to living support, the Dahua Center designs homes for their growth, develops their various interests and abilities, and nurtures their character. The enhancement of the local teachers is also part of the efforts of the staff of Dahua Center, in the hope of achieving a sustainable and long-term impact.

We are glad to see that the work of the co-workers at the Dahua Center in caring for orphans, disabled children, and families in need has not been halted by the epidemic. We anticipate a lot of uncertainty in 2022, but no matter what the circumstances are, we will strive to respond to the needs of the underprivileged we serve with the strength that is given to us.

Dahua Silver Lining Care Center is a charity organization dedicated to providing schooling, childcare, rehabilitation, and education for orphans, needy children, and children with disabilities in Dahua Xian. Based in the Yao Mountains and rooted in the community, Dahua Silver Lining promotes the protection of local underprivileged children from different entry points, such as orphans' foster care, poverty alleviation, and schooling, schooling in mountainous areas, rehabilitation and education of disabled children, care for left-behind children, early childhood development and medical assistance.

In 2021, Dahua Silver Lining continued to adopt the "simulated family" model to provide family care services for orphans in the mountainous areas of Dahua. Throughout the year, Silver Lining served 85 children and 7 families. The four main areas of service are: children have a safe and stable home and living and learning environment; children are recognized and acknowledged; children are well cared for; and children are engaged, supported, nurtured, and protected.

"Give Orphans a Home" and Amazing Grace Academy

In order to provide a safe and welcoming environment for orphans and children in hardship in Myanmar, in 2017, Silver Lining Myanmar launched the "Give Orphans a Home" program in Pyin Oo Lwin City and created the Amazing Grace Academy to care for orphans and special children in a family setting. As of 2021, 149 children have been supported and 14 families have been formed, continuing to accomplish the goal of "Giving Orphans a Home".

The project faces many challenges and implications in 2021. The political revolution in Burma on February 1 led to a general strike across the country, massive protests, and difficulties in withdrawing money from banks. Violent clashes continue to occur, local supplies are tight, and prices are soaring. With no sign of the new pandemic slowing down, Family Village's management must do everything possible to ensure that operating funds are available to create more online learning programs to ensure that the children's lives, learning, health, and safety are met at Family Village.

Pyin Oo Lwin Foster Family Project

In Myanmar, many children are orphaned and left uncared for because of families in poverty, war, and drugs. In order to help orphans in different parts of Myanmar rebuild the dignity of their lives, Silver Lining Missions has launched two foster family programs in Lashio and Namsang to help children in terms of wellness, education, development, and protection.

During the outbreak in 2021, Silver Lining continues to provide foster families with basic health care, medical support, and access to learning and supervise children to develop healthy living habits. We are also adding online video conferencing to provide questions and training for caregivers. We also provide family days and birthday celebrations to help the children and their foster families strengthen their relationships. The children's mental health, daily living skills, social integration, and self-care skills have all been significantly improved. In terms of learning, the children's academic performance has improved significantly through the provision of video materials, Chinese language classes, and character classes.

Guangxi Silver Lining Service Center (hereinafter referred to as Guangxi Silver Lining) has been supporting the rehabilitation and education of children with cerebral palsy from poor families since 2007, and after 14 years of precipitation, the services of Guangxi Silver Lining have been significantly developed. At present, Guangxi Silver Lining has 42 staff members, carrying out six categories of services, including rehabilitation and education for children with disabilities, family support and care, social integration of children with disabilities, community education and advocacy, community rehabilitation, employment and empowerment of youth with disabilities and parents of children with disabilities, to help children with disabilities improve their abilities and integration into the community.

Guangxi Silver Lining adheres to the value of "walking with you with unflinching love and bringing life-changing hope!" It respects children with disabilities as complete individuals, combines the learning of physical ability, intelligence, self-care, communication, and socialization of children with disabilities, breaks professional boundaries, and guides children with disabilities to achieve holistic development with consistent teaching concepts and educational methods.

In the fall semester of 2021, there are a total of 12 classes, including one daycare class for children with multiple disabilities, three classes for the early childhood group, six classes for the elementary school group (grades 1–6), and two classes for the junior high school group (Form I and II), serving a total of 128 children with disabilities.

Dahua Silver Lining has been carrying out the Holistic Development Service for Children with disabilities since 2016, providing a combination of rehabilitation, education, and life for children with disabilities, and actively raising social resources to reduce the rehabilitation and education expenses of children with disabilities by about 20,000 RMB/year. To allow more children with disabilities, those in remote areas, to also receive professional rehabilitation and education. In 2021, 11 children with disabilities will participate in distance education, with 1 rehabilitation class and 1 cultural class provided by teachers and rehabilitation teachers every day. Home visits are made every three months to assess children and give parents guidance on home rehabilitation.

As the new coronavirus continues to ravage Myanmar in 2021, political turmoil has erupted in Myanmar since February, with strikes and protests, and shutdowns in all sectors of business. But ECDC has never given up on supporting children with disabilities and has been providing rehabilitation and education services in a number of ways, including through online classes, phone interviews, and even home visits. In terms of livelihood, to help children with disabilities and their families get through the challenging times, with the support of the program ECDC distributed emergency food assistance to 160 families in need 3 times from May to July, and increased to 250 families in need 4 times from September to December, continuing to provide emergency food assistance to help families with more confidence to persist with the rehabilitation and education of their children with disabilities.

In 2021, as the new epidemic continues to affect the lives of people in Vietnam, Center remains committed to supporting children with disabilities by opening its center from January to May to provide face-to-face teaching and rehabilitation services for children with cerebral palsy. In mid-February and mid-May, Center adjusted its teaching methods due to the outbreak of an epidemic in Hanoi. After June, Center responded to the government's call to encourage isolation at home and continued to teach online without interruption through the Internet. In the second half of the year, the Vietnamese government did not allow schools and centers of all types to open but accelerated the campaign to promote full vaccination against covid-19, teachers and parents at the centers have almost completed the two doses of vaccine, and the centers are expected to resume school in 2022 when all children have had the opportunity to receive the vaccine.

In 2021, Guangxi Silver Lining actively integrates resources to provide diversified services for urban itinerant children from the child, family, school, and community perspectives to build a friendly network through a long-term linkage model of "social worker & school & volunteer". Through the services of book lending, weekend-themed activities, children's independent planning, summer camps, parenting education, character education classes, community outreach, etc. We promote the overall development in the community, enhance the capacity of children and parents, and address the difficulties encountered by itinerant children in the process of living, supervision, and growth. The number of beneficiaries reached about 6,199 throughout the year.

Dahua Silver Lining provides early childhood education and childcare services to at least 40 children aged 0–6 in at least 3 rural communities or resettlement communities. 67 children are provided with early childhood education and childcare services from January to December 2021 in Qingpo Village Shanmi Tun, Nayin, and Gujiang resettlement areas in Dahua.

Dahua Silver Lining is establishing profiles for at least 150 children in 5 rural communities or resettlement communities and offering them psychosocial support services. Building a climate of caring and communication among communities. The services are carried out in 6 rural communities or resettlement site communities in Qingpo Village, Nangnan Tun of Nanghe Village, Qiangwe Township, Nalang Tun of Qiangwe Township, Qiang Sen New Ecological Zone, Dahua Gujiang Resettlement Area, and Dahua Nayin Resettlement Area. The 6 communities constantly serve about 250 children.

The pandemic is still severe in 2021, and for safety reasons, Nam Wung school has not been opened normally, and children have been out of school for two years. As a result of the epidemic, many parents lost their jobs, many older children went out to work to supplement their family income, and some of them participated in telecom fraud activities.

Through the cooperation with the Nan Wung village committee, and the support of caring people, Silver Lining has been able to provide tutorial classes for the students; support families with children in need in the mountainous area of Nanzhan, providing them with rice, oil, and living necessities to aid the daily expenses of the families.

PYCC (Partnership Youth Care Center) was established in Yangon in December 2019 and will apply for registration as a non-profit organization in January 2020.

In early February 2021, civil unrest erupted in Myanmar, combined with the impact of the new pandemic, various industries were shut down, prices soared, schools were closed, and PYCC arranged for students to be quarantined at home. PYCC currently serves 20 youth in need between the ages of 14 and 16, supporting them to live in the center and study at a nearby Myanmar school, promoting their success and contributing to society.

Student Care Center takes care of youth in distress over the age of 12. We have grown from 22 youths at the beginning of the year to 43 youths currently. We use the concept of holistic growth to provide these youths with a stable and safe living environment, sufficient food, and daily necessities. To provide vaccinations, medical checkups, daily disease prevention, and help youths receive and complete their basic education.

Emergency Medical Assistance

In collaboration with the Yagon Centre for Disabled Children (ECDC), Silver Lining is supporting emergency food relief activities by distributing rice, cooking oil, Burmese beans or onions, disposable medical masks, etc. A total of 7 relief activities were held in May, June, July, September, October, November, and December 2021. Throughout the year, 1,480 families in hardship have benefited from these events, and have been able to overcome these difficulties one at a time.

Although Vietnam is not in similar unrest as Myanmar, the overall impact of the epidemic is still significant, with many families losing their jobs and income. 22 families in need at Dac Thang Church.

A small-scale relief effort was held in October 2021, with a total of 70 families receiving emergency food assistance, including rice, cooking oil, dried fish, eggs, and other supplies.

Vocational Training

In 2021, the operation of Guangxi Silver Lining basically resumed as usual. In terms of vocational education, in addition to customer service, IT courses, PS, and other computer application techniques were also conducted for the youths. At the same time, we also carried out " Ride the cyber express, please fasten the seat belt" The "cyber safety group", and" career planning group" were carried out for the disabled youths in the center who use cell phones too frequently and so on. Let the junior center teenager's career development awareness, explore innovative ideas, their own ability awareness, and other topics to debate and train. In June this year, two teenagers were successfully employed and entered a new stage of life.

Holistic Development

Life-long learning is a challenge for children and parents with disabilities. Having a positive attitude, not losing themselves in difficulties, not giving up in adversities, and knowing themselves better in good times are lifelong learning courses for children with disabilities and parents. Guangxi Silver Lining has introduced 9 character traits throughout the year, namely respect, punctuality, tolerance, diligence, initiative, patience, independence, self-confidence, gratitude, and honesty, and carried out corresponding theme activities.

In November, a talent contest was held in conjunction with the Confident Character theme. The contest had three types of categories: acting, painting, and calligraphy, 78 children from the center participated with great enthusiasm. The talent competition gave children a platform to show themselves. Guangxi Silver Lining builds character culture through this series of activities, creates an atmosphere of character education, promotes the shaping of children's character, and lets good character influence each other among children so that children can grow up healthily.

Inside the Family Village, we have been closed to the public so that our co-workers and children have the latest knowledge and training on covid-19 preparedness. The children were provided with basic medical care. In particular, in July and August of this year, many of our coworkers and children were infected with the covid-19. We do not take it lightly, and we are handling it with the highest quarantine standards.

Dare2Dream



Dare2Dream is our new project that is meant to inspire our children to pursue their dreams and achieve their passions in life. Although they may be orphaned or disabled, we help push them and 'Dare' them to reach higher—to dream bigger. We do this by challenging them to excel in their chosen team activities which include dance, athletics, music, and cooking.

We hope that they can connect with this generation's youth and young adults by showing that although they may look different, speak different languages, and are thousands of miles apart, they are still connected as one. The result of this is aimed to inspire this generation to pursue their dreams.

In the coming months, we will hold performances at our orphanage that highlight the hard efforts of our dreamers, invite film crews to come and record these shows, and hopefully begin to participate in competitions both domestically and abroad. If our children can dream so can you!



2021 Financial Report Summary



On behalf of Silver Lining Missions, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to our donors for their support and trust to us over the past year.

In the year of 2021, it was full of challenges. Under the impact of the global economic slowdown, the donations we received this year have decreased significantly. In addition, at the beginning of the year, the Delta variant virus spread rapidly around the world, and Myanmar, Vietnam and other countries became the hardest hit areas. People died from the epidemic. To make matters worse, a military coup broke out in Myanmar at the beginning of the year, and wars broke out in many places in Myanmar. Because of the need of Myanmar, we spend more funding to response to the need of the people there. Silver Lining Foundation are not afraid of difficulties, because of the persistent support from our donors. For this reason, the children in Silver Lining Missions continue to feel the love and warmth from our ministry.

In terms of donation income in 2021, Silver Lining Missions was received a total of approximately \$2.59 million. In 2021, our regular donations account for 39% of our total revenue, corporate and institutional donations account for 17% of our total revenue, and personal donations account for 42% of our total revenue. The income for this year is 28% less than our budget. The main reasons for the decrease in income are that some fundraising activities cannot be carried out due to the epidemic, and a major fund's support for China projects has decreased.


In terms of expenditure, we tried our best to reduce non-essential expenditures in various projects in the beginning of 2021. In the end, the actual expenditure in 2021 was \$400,000 more than the actual expenditure in 2020. Our spending percentage on programs for orphans (orphanages) and rehabilitation programs for special children (rehabilitation centers for special children) were accounted for 27 percent and 40 percent, respectively. Due to the increase in demand, we have added many children to our orphan projects in China and Myanmar. At the same time, due to the war in Myanmar, we have also admitted dozens of children into our Youth Center for the poverty youth in Myanmar. As a result of the increase in expenditure, our Youth Center has increased to \$294,000 (12% of the total funds) this year to support the board, lodging and study needs of these war-torn children. Even so, the administrative and fundraising costs of Silver Lining Missions in 2021 were accounted for only 3% and 2%. It can be seen that 95% of the total expenditure is directly invested and benefited from the services of orphans and special need children.

We value your trust very much, and we sincerely committed to be good stewards, cherishing every penny, and working to ensure that funds and resources are used efficiently. We cherish every life and fulfill their hope and future with the resources entrusted to us. In the context of the slowdown of the world economy, we hold on to our beliefs and are more grateful to have you all along, walking with the most vulnerable and helpless people in society. Your contributions are changing the lives of orphans and special need children.


